

Domestic Abuse

Step #1 - Find support.

If you are experiencing domestic violence, it is important to get connected with an advocate who can provide support, referrals, and provide you with available services. Abusive partners are usually good at ensuring their partner's isolation, making it difficult for the victim to find support. Consequently, victims may feel disconnected from friends and family to ask for help. If seeking help from family and friends is not an option for the victim, they can contact any of the following resources which can provide resources, help with options to stay safe, or simply listen.

Step #2 - Plan for safety.

Find a way to get out of the house quickly, have an arranged suitcase ready to go, and let your neighbors know of your situation. Step #3: Find Resources for your child and you.

Homelessness

Step #1 - Access a shelter or housing service.

If you are experiencing homelessness, reach out to the 2-1-1 United Way Hotline which has trained staff ready 24/7 to assist you with finding shelters, healthcare, food, and any other social services program.

Step #2 – Find options other than the shelter.

Remaining in your permanent housing facility or arranging long term living with friends or family members is a safer option than remaining at a shelter. Upon calling 2-1-1, they may be able to assist you in elongating your stay at your permanent housing facility.

Step #3 – Find need specific help.

Discrimination and Harassment in the Workplace

Step #1 - Inform your employer.

If you sense any form of discrimination, it's essential to communicate with either your employer or the human resources department. Discriminatory conduct often remains unnoticed at work, making it crucial for affected employees to bring it to their employer's attention. By informing your employer, they will be obliged to adhere to state and federal laws to safeguard your rights.

Step #2 - Request a written letter from employer.

After discussing the matter with your employer or human resources department, it's advisable to ask for a written report of the incident and obtain a copy for your records. Additionally, you should request them to conduct an investigation into your allegations and take appropriate disciplinary action against the person involved. Employers are obligated to promptly address all claims of discrimination and harassment; they cannot merely dismiss the case once you've filed a complaint.

Step #3 - Keep detailed notes.

It is crucial to maintain comprehensive records of any previous or forthcoming occurrences of discrimination or harassment. Be sure to document the time, date, and location of each incident, as well as the individuals involved, any witnesses, and the specifics of the improper behavior. Keeping these detailed notes will prove valuable in building your case.

Step #4 – File a claim.

If you've already reported the incident(s) to your employer, but they haven't taken any action or the inappropriate behavior persists, it's time to file a claim. An attorney can assist you in deciding whether to pursue a state or federal discrimination claim, depending on the specifics of your case. Remember, if you feel that your employer has treated you unfairly or retaliated against you for filing a claim, there are laws in place to protect your rights.

 You have the option to submit a claim with either the Department of Fair Employment and Housing (https://calcivilrights.ca.gov/) or the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (EEOC) (https://www.eeoc.gov/).

Step #5 – Consult with an Attorney.

Initiating a workplace discrimination claim is a challenging process that requires the assistance of a seasoned attorney. With their expertise, you can effectively collect the necessary information and evidence to strive for the most favorable outcome in your case. Taking this action can serve as a deterrent, potentially preventing further instances of discriminatory and harassing behaviors. The following are some local employment discrimination law offices:

Unemployment/Loss of Job

Step #1 – Feel your emotions, then move on.

Right after losing your job, it's common to undergo a range of emotions, like panic due to the loss of income, excitement about the new freedom from a routine, and anger at the dedication invested in the previous role. Acknowledge these feelings as normal, but the key is to move on and concentrate on what lies ahead. The author's own experience of being laid off with colleagues formed a support group, offering comfort, motivation, and job leads. If you find yourself struggling alone, consider joining a group or seeking professional support to find comfort and encouragement while managing negative emotions.

Step #2 – Tell everyone (even strangers!).

It's likely that your self-esteem has suffered, and admitting "I'm unemployed" out loud can make it even more real and difficult to handle. While you might feel inclined to hide your situation, it's important to share it with friends and family. They won't be able to assist if they don't know what you're going through. Informing people that you're open to new opportunities is the initial step towards kickstarting your job search.

Step #3 - Get Your Finances in Check and Create a Budget.

Determine your available resources to avoid accumulating debt during a financially challenging period. The disparity between your previous paycheck and the amount received from severance or unemployment benefits will dictate whether you need to make spending adjustments and the extent of those adjustments. Step #4 - Apply for unemployment.

Step #5 – Invest in your personal development.

If taking a few classes can enhance your marketability and you have the financial means, don't hesitate to pursue them. The author personally experienced the positive impact of writing workshops during their downtime, as it boosted their self-esteem and provided a constructive outlet. It also motivated them to dress presentably again.

Investing in services like resume polishing or a career coach should be viewed as an investment in your future success. And once you secure an interview, treating yourself to a new outfit will pay off in increased confidence and better outcomes.

Step #6 - Start your job hunt!

Now that you have invested in your personal development and feel ready to begin exploring job opportunities, begin your job hunt by exploring jobs you are interested in and remember to apply rationally and broadly.
